**THE LANDSCAPES OF LYNN BOGGESS**

In this exhibition, Boggess present a selection of his landscapes paintings, the subjects of which reflect the diverse nature of West Virginia and its flora. Using all vertical formats, Boggess draws the viewer into the deeply receding spaces of his images. The pictures, devoid of human or animal habitation, focus on Nature, free of the influence of human activity. Boggess compels the viewer to contemplate each scene in turn, and finally the cycle of scenes: the lapse of hours; the alternating character of the rocks.
